

HISTORY

(Visit to Wantage Museum)

Pupils will have the opportunity to experience Victorian life through the eyes of a Victorian child. They will use primary evidence which will include: Victorian paintings and photos; censuses; Victorian artefacts including games; school log books. All of this will help them investigate whether today's children or Victorian children had the most fun.

SCIENCE

Light and Shadows: Pupils will explore the importance and effects of light through investigations. They will learn how and where shadows are formed and why they change over time. They will have the opportunity to use light sensors to help measure. They will apply their findings to creating their own silhouettes.

MFL/ FRENCH 'Getting To Know You'

Pupils will explore the language through games, songs and stories.

R.E.

Harvest: Pupils will research the importance of harvest around the world.

Parables of Jesus: Pupils will have the opportunity to listen to and learn about different New Testament parables through story telling, drama and games.

ART/ DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

Charcoal: Pupils will have the opportunity to create different effects with charcoal. They will then apply these effects in their own Victorian urban landscape.

L S Lowry: Pupils will study his paintings and discuss them and use them as an inspiration for their charcoal landscape.

Levers: Pupils will explore, design, make and evaluate a toy using levers.
